SPECIAL ELECTION MARCH 19TH

Enrolled Members of the Pawnee Nation will once again vote in a Special Election. This election is to fill the office of Vice-President of the Nation. In the previous Special Election, Vice-President W. Bruce Pratt won the seat for President and his previous position is now vacant. Currently, Secretary LittleSun is serving as interim Vice-President and Council Man SpottedHorseChief is serving as Interim Secretary of the Business Council. Election day is scheduled for Saturday, March 19, 2016 at the Multi-purpose Building, 808 Morris Road on the Pawnee Reserve.

On pages two and three of this publication, candidate pictures and campaign/bio letters are available.

The remaining schedule of events for this Special Election include: the posting of the results by 12:00 p.m. on Monday March 21, 2016, a protest period from March 22-24, 2016 with a protest deadline of 5 p.m. March 24th, the Certification of the Election Results on April 1, 2016 and the Inauguration of the new Pawnee Nation Vice-President is scheduled for Saturday, April 2, 2016.

Remember all Absentee Ballots must be received by the Pawnee Nation Election Commission on or before Saturday, March 19, 2016.

Pawnee Nation Resource Complex Project Begins

The Pawnee Nation Resource Complex is currently in construction phase. BID 1 package was opened in January and it contained all the utility contracts. As of February 19th concrete was being poured for the footings. The PNR will house a library, media/conference room, and offices for THPO and ICW. The project is expected to complete in the Fall of 2016.

New Project is Approved by HUD

The FY-15 ICDBG Project: Pawnee Nation Aquatic Health Center (PNAHC)

The U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) announced \$55.5 million to 75 Native American communities throughout the country to improve housing conditions and stimulate community development, including construction projects and local jobs for low- and moderate-income families. The grants are provided through HUD's Indian Community Block Grant Program, ICDBG, which supports a wide range of community development and affordable housing activities.

The Pawnee Nation received official notification on February 16, 2016, for the approved funding for the FY-15 ICDBG Project: Pawnee Nation Aquatic Health Center.

The Pawnee Nation was awarded the \$800,000 grant to construct a new Aquatic Health Center which will house an indoor saltwater pool and a pool with therapeutic aspects. This will be an expansion of the Pawnee Nation Wellness Center. The center will be able to provide physical activity to those who cannot currently participate in an exercise program. The water based exercise program will provide an opportunity to those who are physically limited and the elder population of the Pawnee Nation community, many whom suffer from disease, to live a greater quality of life.

As you can see, there are many new and exciting things being accomplished by our Nation. In closing, I hope you all will exercise your right to vote and vote in the Vice President election on March 19th.

Marshall R. Gover

Nowah. My name is Marshall Gover and I am running for Pawnee Business Council Vice-President. My paternal grandparents were Shield Chief and Viola Wilde. My maternal grandparents were Marshall Smith and Clara Smith, who were Baptist Ministers. I am the son of Steven G. Gover and Vera Faye Gover, who were on the Southern Baptist Mission Board. I am a Vietnam combat veteran and served honorably in the Marine Corps from 1965 to 1969.

When people run for Pawnee Business Council, different ones make promises, "When I get elected, I will do this" or I will do that". If elected, the only promise that I can make you is that I will do the very best I can. It takes the whole Business Council to do things. It takes a majority vote of a quorum. That's why we call it the Business Council. It's not one individual that makes decisions for the whole Nation. I believe that the Pawnee Nation is the greatest Nation on the face of the earth. The Pawnee Nation should be leading in every aspect and we should be the example for all Indian Nations. We should be the leaders in government, business and all of our endeavors. We should have the best employee base in Indian Country. We should use our resources wisely and in a way that is exemplary to other Nations.

I believe a tribal leader should be knowledgeable in our tribal traditions and culture and should participate. They should be present at all Council and Committee meetings. When we have Visitation, Veterans Dances, Skidi Dance, Kitkehahki Dance, Young Dog Dance, handgames, any activity, our Council Members should be there to represent the Council whenever they can.

I have been fortunate enough to be recognized by different agencies and appointed to national committees. I serve on the Direct Service Tribes National Committee, for those who receive their health services from the Federal Government. Our clinic is a Direct Service Tribe Clinic and we represent concerns of all direct service tribes regarding health care. I have been instrumental in negotiations with I.H.S. to be able to move money from line item to line item like Self-Governance organizations are allowed. I was awarded the I.H.S. Director's Special Recognition, Tribal Leadership/Partnership award for my efforts in advocating for those concerns. Other Committees that I have been honored to sit on include Substance Abuse and Mental Health Service Administration Committee, Secretary's Advisory Committee for Health and Human Services and within the last four years, I have been

a representative on the Oklahoma Area budget Formulation for I.H.S. to present priorities for the Oklahoma area. I have been privileged to represent concerns of Indian people, not just the Pawnee people, but also the people of the United States by being a part of these organizations and committees. It has had an impact on our service unit. In treaties we were promised education and health care, it has been a struggle to get the U.S. Government to hold up to their promises. When I met with President Obama, I reminded him of those promises and mentioned that we are only funded at 54% for health care and that we needed to be funded the full 100% for our people, so that in crisis it is not just life or limb, but so we can have preventative medicine instead of crisis medicine.

My promise to you is that I will do the best I can for our people and I ask for your support in the upcoming elections. I pray that God Almighty will Bless this Pawnee Nation.

Darrell J. Wildcat

Nowah! My name is Darrell J. Wildcat and I am a candidate for Vice-President of the Pawnee Tribe Business Council.

I am the son of the late Jimmie Wildcat, a full blood Euchee Indian and Eunice Hadley Wildcat, a full blood Pawnee. My paternal Grandparents are Maxey Wildcat and Lizzie Big Head Wildcat. My maternal Grandparents are Jasper Hadley and Alice Echohawk. I belong to the Kitkahaki Band.

I grew up and attended school in Tulsa, Oklahoma. After graduating from Will Rogers High School, I enrolled at Northeastern Oklahoma A&M College at Miami, Oklahoma. After attending three semesters in college I enlisted in the U.S. Army. I served with the 10th Special Forces Group (Airborne), 1st Special Forces. My overseas duty was in Germany, during the Vietnam Era. Following my time with the military, I attended Southwest Indian Polytechnic Institute in Albuquerque, New Mexico. After earning my certificate in printing, I worked at various print shops in Oklahoma City.

I then moved to Norman and attended the University of Oklahoma. While there, I was given the opportunity to work for Poe and Associates, an engineering firm in Oklahoma City. I was hired to work on a land survey crew since I had experience from working in that capacity part time during high school. I worked for Poe and Associates for 5 years eventually becoming a Party Chief with my own crew. On the job we laid out boundary surveys, Rights of Way, housing subdivisions, locate underground utilities, layout highway turn lanes and intersections.

After 5 years, I went to work for the Bureau of Indian Affairs as a civil engineering technician. My duties were to layout construction stakes for road improvements, layout bridge sites and parking lots. In time, I was trained as a Contracting Officer Representative. At the job site I would make sure all items in the contract were adhered to and Federal guidelines followed. For example, some duties were to check workmanship and safety measures, quality of materials, the equipment which was used at the job site, kept records of down time of equipment and looked over requests for payment from vendors to compare the payment request to work actually completed.

Outside of my occupational duties, I served on the Parent Committee for the Anadarko Public Schools Indian Education Program. This program provides services such as activities that stress high academic achievement, overseeing tutoring, providing school supplies, initiating student cultural activities and community involvement.

I also served the community as a member of the City Council representing Ward 4 for the City of Anadarko, Oklahoma.

I worked with the Oklahoma State Department of Tourism, International Section. I travelled to Germany, France, The Netherlands, and Poland. I coordinated tour operations from all over the world to promote economic development in our Indian communities throughout Oklahoma.

I have been involved with cultural events my entire life. I have coordinated, danced and participated at pow-wows all over the nation. I served as Whip Man, Tail Dancer and was the Drum Keeper for the Pawnee Indian Veterans Organization. I have sponsored peyote meetings to honor family members and currently a member of the Norman First American United Methodist Church, Norman, OK.

I am currently retired from the Roads and Transportation Department, Southern Plains Regional Office, Bureau of Indian Affairs, Anadarko. My wife Carla and I reside in Norman, Oklahoma.

With my 27 years of experience in federal government, city government, and community service, I will provide the kind of leadership and commitment we need to move forward as a nation.

Nowa, Pawnee relatives, my name is John J. Only A Chief. I believe I am a well-qualified candidate for the office of Vice President as I was elected to the Pawnee Business Council for a four-year term on Council Seat #1 (2007-2011). During my term, I served as Chair of the Human Resource Committee; Chair of the Utility Authority; Housing Authority Monitor; Budget Committee Member. These first hand experiences provided me a working knowledge and understanding of the details of tribal programs and how they operate. My years in office provided me the opportunity to acquire knowledge of tribal government functions, also to listen to people willingly share their concerns and ideas.

These past two years, I have been preparing for the Vice Presidency in two ways: 1. Attending local sporting events, community and cultural activities to be involved with community members in sharing fun and listening and learning their concerns of current tribal issues affecting them; 2. Attending Pawnee Business Council Meetings and Commission Meetings. At some meetings, I do ask questions for clarification of certain points for my understanding of the major issues under discussion.

I also ask questions for those tribal members who express their questions and concerns. These are a few examples of those questions and concerns discussed with some Pawnee members. They want satisfactory answers for their benefit and that of the Pawnee Nation:

- Where is the accounting of the \$4.2 million dollars Salazar settlement?
- Is there a \$600,000 deficit, even with the \$4.2 million settlement?
- How will the forth coming \$1.2 million IHS Contract Support Adjustment money be spent?
- How much and where are the TDC funds going?

- Who makes the decisions on those expenditures?
- How many Pawnee Tribal members are in Executive Positions on TDC?
- What are the qualifications and how many Pawnees are on the TDC Board?
- Are the Pawnee people being informed about proposed or planned business ventures?

I value commitment and dedication in any Pawnee Tribal business venture. I support TDC and its course of action to provide needed revenue for the Pawnee Nation. I am equally committed to employing those with qualified experience and /or educated Pawnees who are capable of filling the high-ranking, executive tribal positions. I will do my best to ensure you are truly and fully represented in all areas. My true promise is to respectfully and faithfully serve the Pawnee Nation and our people. I shall do so by working closely with the Council in addressing the agenda set forth.

As Vice President, I shall uphold the integrity and respectability of the office. I shall be ready and willing to listen to you. I offer to be your voice where it needs to be heard. More importantly, I will work with the President, Treasurer, Secretary and the other Council members in dutifully carrying out our Constitutional obligations in honorably serving the Pawnee Nation and its people. Nawa! My name is Misty M. Nuttle and I am seeking the position of Vice-President of the Pawnee Business Council. My parents are Neva R. and George H. Pratt and the late Samuel E. Nuttle. My Grandparents are Neva Horsechief Moore and the late Thurman F. Moore and the late Pearl Osborne Nuttle and Frank (Bubby) Nuttle. I have three children; Drew, Jaden and Adiliah and have resided in Pawnee for the majority of my life. I graduated from Skiatook High School in 1994 and obtained an Associate of Arts degree with emphasis in Tribal Management in 2004 at Haskell Indian Nations University in Lawrence, KS and in 2008 received a Bachelor of Science degree with emphasis in Business/Management from the University of Phoenix in Rockville, MD.

I possess a broad array of work experience, some of which includes; health care administration, 3rd party insurance coding, billing, insurance follow-ups, tribal development coordination, Planning Director, Finance, grant management and grant administration, grant writing, oral and written reporting of goal and objectives, policy writing and implementation, SWOT analysis, feasibility studies and financial analysis, budget development and execution. All of this experience is beneficial and has assisted me in my ability to grasp concepts relative to implementing feasible solutions to address tribal issues, evaluate situations and make informed decisions. A characteristic of a good leader is to instill rational processes so the Pawnee Business Council can advance as a group as I believe, success should be with the organization, not the leader(s). Executive instinct, critical thinking, utilizing a thorough decision making process and being able to sift through massive amounts of information/research are required in order to be accountable for any position on the Business Council. One must also be driven and possess initiative to want to find answers and sustaining solutions to address issues that affect our tribal organization. You must be able to be a visionary business leader with the needs of all tribal members kept in mind.

I previously held the positions of Treasurer and President of the

Pawnee Business Council and during my tenure was able to oversee completion of deficient Indirect Cost proposals for 2012-2015, worked to address the repeated audit findings the Nation has had since 2010, and initiated financial processes which have assisted the Nation in approving a 2016 comprehensive budget during the 2015 fiscal year. Also, initiation of the development of a comprehensive strategic plan had begun in order to define goals and priorities the Nation needs to address in order to optimize services and resources. If elected, I would advocate resuming this much needed tool that would assist the Nation in utilizing our resources efficiently and effectively and to develop and implement a series of undertakings to incorporate our culture and language into our daily systems and processes. These undertakings would definitely be in alignment with the goals and priorities of the Cultural Resources Division. As stated before, we are in dire need a Social Services Division to assist tribal members in emergency or crisis situations and to continue to identify areas that are needed in order to address the needs of our people. In anticipation of the 2017 budget call, I am prepared to assist the current Treasurer in identifying spending patterns of all tribal programs, services and organizational entities, such as the Pawnee Nation College, Pawnee Tribal Housing Authority and Tribal Development Corporation, and to provide recommendations for addressing needs, areas of shortfall and adequately tracking expenses to assist in planning for the upcoming fiscal year. Most importantly, is being able to ascertain the Nation's financial position at any given time.

My goal for the Pawnee Nation is to have a sound and solidified system of operations that will be able to incorporate and institute processes and operations to fulfill economic ventures and employment opportunities for our Pawnee people. These processes will promote our way of life and strive to meet the needs of all factions of our people. We need leaders who are capable of providing guidance and direction, possess the knowledge and understanding of Federal and State programs, be able to decipher Federal regulations, laws, policies and codes in order to exercise our self-governance and authority to the fullest extent, with open communication, and most importantly implementing positive changes across the whole organization. We must have holistic approaches to address member needs and be able to work cohesively and for the greater good of ALL Pawnee people. I believe I possess these qualities and will work hard to ensure we take advantage of as many opportunities as we can in order to once again become an economic powerhouse in Indian country. 

#15-99 – A Resolution to approve the contract for Builder's Unlimited, Inc. as the construction manager of the FY-14 ICDBG Project: Pawnee Nation Resource Complex and the proposed GMP of \$903,985.57 – Approved December 2, 2015 by a vote of five for, zero against, zero abstaining, one absent (L.Teter) and one not voting (President Pratt).

#15-100 – A Resolution to approve the revision of Pawnee Nation's Office of Human Resources Policies and Procedures Manual's Chapters 8 and 9 which shall replace previous versions and become effective on the date of approval by the Pawnee Business Council – Approved December 2, 2015 by a vote of five for, zero against, zero abstaining, one absent (L.Teter) and one not voting (President Pratt).

#15-101 – A Resolution to approve the revision of Pawnee Nation's Office of Human Resources Policies and Procedures Manual's "Chapter 9, Section N. Tobacco Free Worksite Policy" which shall replace the version dated November 12, 2014 and become effective on the date of approval by the Pawnee Business Council and in effect create a "Tobacco-free Worksite" for the employees of the Pawnee Nation. This policy shall in no way hinder, effect, or subjugate any form of ceremonial tobacco use on, in or around the Pawnee Nation Campus – Approved December 2, 2015 by a vote of five for, zero against, zero abstaining, one absent (L.Teter) and one not voting (President Pratt).

Later she began working with the Bureau of Indian Affairs in the Education Department with the Bordertown Dormitory Program in New Mexico and Arizona. She returned to Oklahoma and began employment with the Oklahoma Department of Child Welfare Division. In 1973, she went to work for the BIA as a Social Worker in Anadarko, OK. She relocated to Pawnee in 1978 to work at the Pawnee Agency for approximately 2 years, having also worked in Shawnee, Ponca City, Oklahoma City before returning to the Pawnee Agency for 5 years. A shift in her career began as she moved to Phoenix, AZ where she took an administrative position in the Social Work field. After working there for 5.5 years she took her final social work position in Espanola, NM at the Northern Pueblos Agency where she would retire in 1994 after 30 years of working with the B.I.A. Since her early childhood, Elizabeth had a lifelong ambition to follow in her father’s footsteps and enter tribal politics. Both showed a great love for their Pawnee People. In the late 70’s Elizabeth was one of the first few women to be elected to the serve on the Pawnee Business Council. In 1995 she was elected the first woman President of the Pawnee Business Council. She served 14 years on the PBC. She continued to serve on numerous committees. She was a founding member of the Pawnee Nation College Board of Trustees. She supported and attended all of our Pawnee cultural ceremonies, dances, and activities. She was a Pawnee War Mother’s Chapter “Angel” and a member of the Black Beard Descendants Gourd Dance Group. She was preceded in death by two daughters: Woesta Marie and Babygirl Blackowl. sisters: Naomi, Ella Mae, Alba Jo, Mabel and brothers: Albin Jr. and John. Elizabeth is survived by: Sister Charlene Button of Baxter Springs KS, Daughter, Mary Faye Blackowl, grandchildren Justin and Cheynowa Townsend, great-grandsons Heston Echohawk and Kiwaku Rameriz, all of Pawnee Ok. 3. Fill out an application and submit a copy of child's Pawnee Tribal ID.
4. Please be advised that you must turn in an application for each semester in order to receive a card.

YOUTH SUPPLEMENTAL FUNDS FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

- Q: I turned in an application but never got my card, what happened?
A: You did not submit a Tribal ID, your receipts from the last card were not turned in, or the application was otherwise incomplete. If you believe there was an error, please contact our office.
- Q: Do I have to submit a new application for each semester to receive YSF funds?
A: Yes, this is required to make sure that the child is enrolled in
